More than half of Hawaii's native forests have been severely degraded or lost.

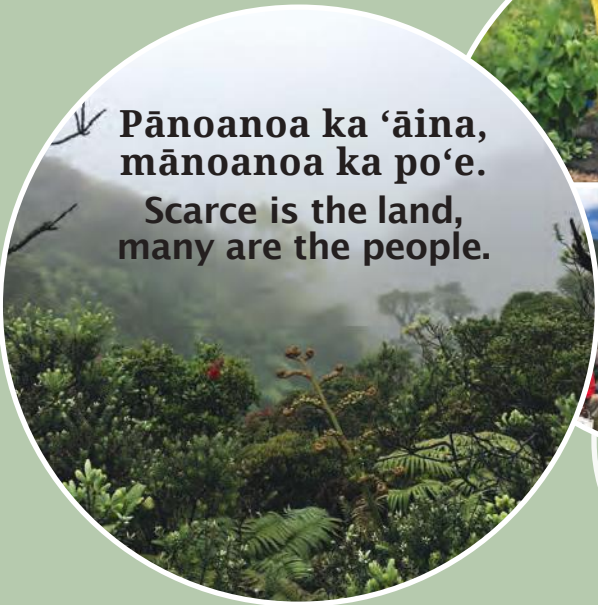


THREATENED

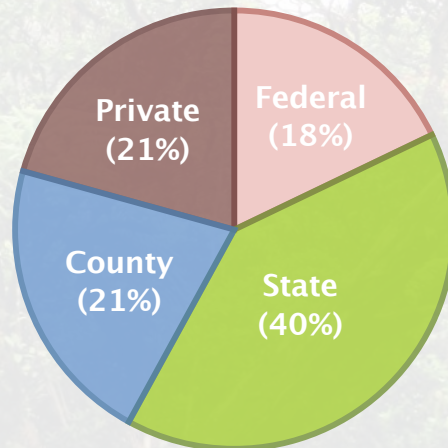
